TO THE BOTTOM OF THE OCEAN

On 25th March this year, film director James Cameron, maker of films such as *Titanic* and *Avatar*, visited the Mariana Trench: the deepest place in any of the world's oceans. It is almost 11,000 metres below the surface of the western Pacific Ocean, close to the Mariana Islands.

Cameron made the journey in a one-man submarine made of thick steel, the *Deepsea Challenger*. It took him two and a half hours to get to the ocean floor. Most of the journey was through blackness, as sunlight only travels about 1,000 metres down through the world's oceans, but the submarine had very strong lights so that Cameron could film the ocean floor and any animals he saw. He plans to make a documentary about his journey.

From the surface of the ocean the distance down to the Mariana Trench is greater than the distance up to the top of the world's highest mountain, Mount Everest (8,848 metres). The wreck of the *Titanic*, which Cameron has also visited in a submarine, is 3,800 metres under the Atlantic Ocean (so far down that it was only discovered in 1985, seventy-three years after the ship sank), but that distance is small in comparison with the depth of the Mariana Trench.

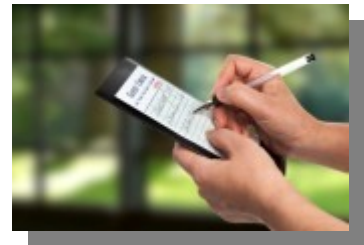
