FORM

AFFIRMATIVE

REGULAR



In general - **end in -ed**

WORK - WORK**ED**



Verbs ending in -e - **add -d**

LIVE - LIVE**D**



Verbs ending in consonant + y
- **end in -ied**

STUDY - STUD**IED**



Short verbs ending in cons. +
vowel + cons. - **double the last**
cons. + **-ed**

PLAN - PLAN**NED**

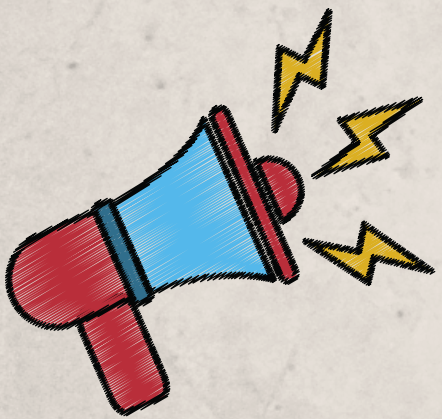
NEGATIVE

Subject + **did** + **not** + **infinitive**

I/YOU/HE/SHE/IT/WE/YOU/THEY - **DIDN'T** STUDY

I/YOU/HE/SHE/IT/WE/YOU/THEY - **DIDN'T** GO

FOR ALL THE
PERSONS



REGULARS AND IRREGULARS TAKE THE INFINITIVE
FORM AFTER DIDN'T

INTERROGATIVE

Did + Subject + **infinitive** ?

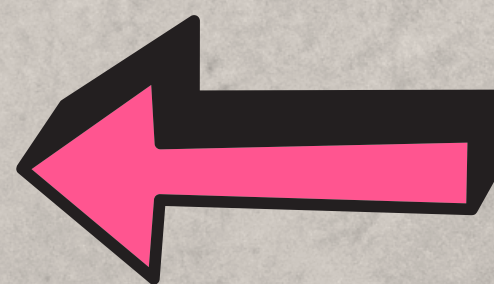
DID I/YOU/HE/SHE/IT/WE/YOU/THEY **WORK?**

DID I/YOU/HE/SHE/IT/WE/YOU/THEY **GO?**



YES, I/YOU/HE/SHE/IT/WE/YOU/THEY **DID**

NO, I/YOU/HE/SHE/IT/WE/YOU/THEY **DIDN'T**

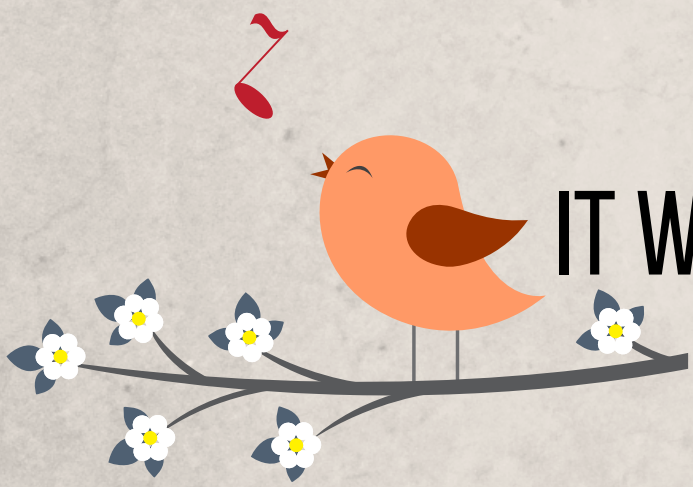
USE

- ★ To show **what somebody was doing** at a **particular time in the past**.



YESTERDAY AT 6:00 PM ANNA **WAS RUNNING** IN THE PARK

- ★ To create **the context of an action in the past**



IT WAS MONDAY, THE SUN **WAS SHINING** AND THE BIRDS **WERE SINGING**

FORM

+ Subject + **was/were** + **gerund** (-ing)

I/HE/SHE/IT **WAS SLEEPING** ON THE SOFA

YOU/WE/THEY **WERE SLEEPING** ON THE SOFA

— Subject + **was/were** + **not** + **gerund** (-ing)

I/HE/SHE/IT **WASN'T SLEEPING** ON THE SOFA

YOU/WE/THEY **WERE N'T SLEEPING** ON THE SOFA

? **was/were** + Subject + **gerund** (-ing) + ?

WAS I/HE/SHE/IT **SLEEPING** ON THE SOFA?

WERE YOU/WE/THEY **SLEEPING** ON THE SOFA?



PAST Perfect

USES



An **action** that **happened before** another **action in the past**

WHEN I **GOT** HOME, HE **HAD LEFT**



Hypothesis in the **past**

IF I **HAD KNOWN** YOUR NUMBER, I **WOULD HAVE CALLED** YOU

**3rd
Conditional**

FORM

+ Subject + **had** + **past participle**

I/YOU/HE/SHE/IT/WE/YOU/THEY **HAD LEFT** BEFORE IT STARTED TO RAIN
HAD COOKED DINNER WHEN MOM GOT HOME

REGULAR -ED

— Subject + **had** + **not** + **past participle**

I/YOU/HE/SHE/IT/WE/YOU/THEY **HADN'T LEFT** WHEN IT STARTED TO RAIN
HADN'T COOKED DINNER WHEN MOM GOT HOME

IRREGULAR
