

experience of eating "real" vegetables. If kids do not know they are eating a vegetable, then they are not getting a chance to "train their taste buds." They should know how the vegetable looks, how it tastes and its texture.

Children are most open to learning new flavors during infancy and in their early years. These are the best times to try giving children the earthy or bitter tastes of some vegetables. As children grow older, it gets harder to introduce these vegetables. Kids like what is familiar. Many are fearful of trying new things. But if children get to experience a food over and over, the food becomes more familiar. Even if they often just see a food, they might not object to eating or at least trying it.

Experts say families should try to eat dinner together, and all should eat the same food at dinner. One expert said, "The best thing parents can do is offer a variety of foods again and again." Kids do not need to eat as much as a parent might think.

Children need to come to the table hungry. A doctor said, "We often do not let young children get hungry enough. We are ready with a bag with food at all moments, when they cry or scrape a knee".

Experts say it is smart to let children help in the kitchen. Let the child help to prepare vegetables for roasting and serving. It is an exciting experience. "When kids carry that dish to the table, they are proud of it".

PERU

Best known as the home of the mountaintop Inca citadel, Machu Picchu, Peru still remains fairly undiscovered as a retirement destination. The cost of living is one of the cheapest anywhere with rents starting as low as \$150 per month and filling three-course lunches starting at \$2,5, including a drink. Compared to other Latin American countries, Peru has an average cost of living. It's cheaper than Brazil, Colombia or Chile, but more expensive than Bolivia or Paraguay. In general, services, food, transportation, accommodations and clothes are cheaper than in Europe or the US. But some products like electronics as well as imported food and clothes are more expensive than in their countries of origin.

COSTA RICA

Costa Rica is one of the safest spots and best places to live in Central America. It welcomes foreigners with open arms. Expats are attracted to Costa Rica for numerous reasons, which include the low cost of living, excellent healthcare, beautiful beaches, rainforests and cool mountains. Many families also look to Costa Rica for their education system. Couples can live well on \$1,500 per month in expenses, including housing, transportation, food and medical expenses. The average local salary is about \$750, so that is usually the absolute lowest you could expect, but \$1,000 is a better super-budget baseline for foreigners.

PANAMA

Panama is an excellent spot for expats, retirees and even digital nomads. It's modern.comfortable, safe and friendly. The lush mountain towns of Panama rank among the best retirement destinations in the world. And many people choose Panama because of the weather and ease of living. It's possible to live in Panama for as low as \$1,000 per month. Ithose looking to buy an apartment should expect to pay around \$200 per square foot in the city centre. Healthcare in Panama is good and affordable for minor problems. Most clinics charge a nominal fee of between \$20 and \$60 for an office visit. Hospitals in larger cities are all of the state-of-the-art equipment and specialists can be found in any field.

I challenge you to find what is perfectly in season and ripe and then just slice it, taste it and serve it. Recipes are a framework but the most important thing is the ingredient, where you find it, how you cook it and how you will turn it into a beautiful meal. I want you to know what food is really alive and seasonal. This is the kind of cooking that nourishes the body and the soul. I want to show you how to buy food in a farmer's market, talk directly to the people who grow your food, go to the market before you decide what to cook, that will free you from an overdependence on recipes. Because if you start with really good ingredients, you don't have to do much to them.

This is the philosophy of food that we serve at Chez Panisse and the food that I cook at home. We're trying to figure out the best way to serve it and not get in the way of the real taste of that food. You can never think about food in the way you may have thought about it in the past. It's about how to use every part of an ingredient very very simply. That's the beautiful thing about this delicious revolution. It'm Alice Waters and this is my MasterClass.

Ballet is essentially a language that is about emotions. It is for me the best language to express emotions in the rawest sense. And it's a language that has no barriers, that anyone can understand from any country and from any background.

RUSSELL MALIPHANT: <u>Tamara does have those qualities of a principal dancer</u>. She's very strong, she's got the willpower, <u>she's got the character</u>, the strength of character that means that she goes beyond technique.

I think the world of ballet is a very fair world because you achieve things based on your merits. **It is much less political than any other world**, and if you put hard work and intelligence into it, you can achieve stardom.

RUSSELL MALIPHANT: <u>There are a lot of sacrifices that you have to make to look after yourself that much</u>. She is going to be in a rehearsal at 7 in the morning and she's not going to think twice about that. She'll be there as many times as it takes.

LAURETTA SUMMERSCALES: It's amazing to see her work, because **she works so hard and she pushes herself to the limit every single day**.

Because it is a profession that is based on your own body, <u>as your body changes</u>, <u>you have to continue to study</u>, <u>to understand how to work with this constant changing tool</u>. It's almost like if a violinist, will have to work with a violin that will change constantly. <u>Most of the time I feel slightly disappointed after a performance</u>, and then sometimes, really rarely, you just do something strange, something that is not about doing the steps better, or is not about even you feeling, it's some kind of release that <u>suddenly you connect completely with the audience</u> and you know they are with you on stage, every step of the way. <u>I've always questioned things</u>, it is <u>my nature to question everything</u> really, but I am more convinced than ever that <u>arts and culture are essential to human beings</u>, that they are what defines us. I feel that <u>going to the ballet is an opportunity to see yourself in a different mirror</u> and give a clarity about your own feelings and about your own future.

INCREDIBLE MEDIEVAL CASTLES IN CASTILE AND LEÓN

The name Castile means simply 'land of castles'. In the Middle Ages, its condition as a frontier between Christians and Muslims caused the initial motivation for the building of fortresses and castles. A tour of some of the best preserved of these fortifications is the perfect excuse to learn more about this land and their people.



Our first trip takes us through the typical Castilian landscapes of plains and countryside to the town of Peñafiel, located beside the Duero river. Its medieval castle stands on a rocky hill and was built in the 11th century. Its peculiar shape is like a ship in the middle of fields. It is also home to the Provincial Wine Museum.

We then continue on to the city of Segovia to visit its famous Alcázar fortress, another of Spain's most emblematic images. This imposing Gothic building was transformed by Philip II in the 16th century in the Herrerian style seen today. It was the residence of the Castilian and Spanish monarchs for two centuries. Its appearance and location are associated with a world of princesses, knights, witches and dragons.

The last of the castles on this route is in the Mudéjar style. La Mota castle is in the town of Medina del Campo. It was built in the 15th century when Medina del Campo reached its maximum splendour: its fairs were the most important in the whole of Europe. This is also the place where Queen Isabella I of Castile died.
